What is SHIBA? SHIBA is a program of the Idaho Department of Insurance. It is funded by both the state and federal government, through the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

What does SHIBA do? SHIBA provides assistance regarding Medicare. SHIBA can help in the following ways:

- Education about Medicare
- One-on-one counseling to assist Medicare beneficiaries in finding the plans that best meet their needs
- Problem-solving assistance related to Medicare, other coverage, or billing issues
- Education on how to prevent, identify and report Medicare fraud and abuse

Is there a fee for SHIBA services? No. All services provided by SHIBA are free. SHIBA has no products to sell and no interest in getting a beneficiary to purchase any particular product. SHIBA is dedicated to helping Medicare beneficiaries understand Medicare and the types of plans available so they can make the best choice for their individual situation.

How does SHIBA do this? SHIBA is a small program. It has a current staffing pattern of 8 coordinators, a supervisor and two administrative staff for the entire state. With nearly 286,000 people eligible for Medicare in Idaho, we can't do it all ourselves.
