FREE FISHING DAY-June 9th

Idaho's Free Fishing Day is an annual event held the second Saturday every June. All anglers, residents and nonresidents, can celebrate the day by fishing Idaho's waters without a license.

If you've never been fishing, **Free Fishing Day** is also a great day to learn. Fish and Game personnel and volunteers set up several free events at local fishing waters throughout the state to help first-timers discover the joys of fishing.

There are a limited number of loaner rods and reels available to practice with but if you have your own equipment you are encouraged to bring it. Fishing trailers will be at Gaver's lagoon in Hagerman with loaner rods and reels!

Other free fishing locations in our area: Roseworth, Dollar Lake, Little Wood, Magic, Rock Creek, Featherville Pond, Camas Ponds, Little Camas Reservoir and Blair Trail.

Temporary Assistance to Families in Idaho (TAFI)

Children in the care of their grandparents may be eligible to apply for Temporary Aid to families in Idaho (TAFI) for "child only" grants.

These grants provide up to \$309/month per family and are available based on the child's income.

Before applying for a "child only" grant, grandparents should be aware that the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare generally brings a child support action against parents when their children apply for TAFI.

However, it is possible for grandparents to apply for a "good cause" exemption from this requirement. Grandparents who believe that a child support action would be disruptive or dangerous should inquire whether they qualify for the "good cause" exemption. Grandparents should keep in mind that TAFI grants are not available if the grandparent adopts the child.
